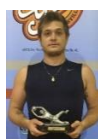


## The Third Summer Futsal Season was the Absolute Most Fun Yet!

## Winter 2016/17 Futsal Season Outlook

Based on recent growth in interest, expectations are for even more adult teams and the formation of two divisions, upper and lower competitive divisions. Further expectations, based on youth soccer club surveys, are for a huge growth in youth team participation. It's looking probable to have three youth divisions of 4 to 6 teams

each. This growth could easily exceed the availability of gyms to play in. We must soon find or build a facility for futsal first, a facility that has basketball and volleyball as secondary sports. Wouldn't that be nice? (Nothing negative here about basketball and volleyball – just basketball courts are often smaller than optimal when used for futsal.)

## Venues for the Next Winter Futsal Season

Last winter the league used two gyms each week (Wednesdays and Fridays) for the youth and adult futsal games. This winter this number will double! Youth will play games in gyms at the Academy for Academics and Arts, at James Clemens High School, at Providence Elementary School and at Richard Showers Recreation Center. Adults will play games in gyms at James Clemens High School, at Providence Elementary School and possibly at Oakwood University around Christmas. Games will be played on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays in November, December and January. A team would play once each weekend.



## Update on Futsal Facilities

There are indoor sports facilities being planned to be built in the near future. A replacement for the Joe Davis Stadium in Huntsville is currently being planned which will have futsal courts marked concentric with basketball courts – quantity TBA. The Madison Parks and Recreation Master Plan 2014-2025 states the need for multiple futsal courts in a multiple-purpose indoor recreation building. These are exciting futures for futsal in North Alabama.

## Second Annual Dixie Defrost Futsal Tournament



Last year's tournament was great. The second year's tournament should be amazing. The Second Annual Dixie Defrost Futsal Tournament will be held on January 21 and 22, 2017. Put this in your plans for the culmination of the winter futsal season. You will not have more fun at any other tournament than at a futsal tournament.



## USFF S.E. Regional Futsal Tournament

Last year's regional tournament was in Charleston, SC, a great place for a number of recent regional tournaments. But the next tournament will be in Augusta, GA, in 2017. And plans are for the regional tournament to come to Alabama in 2018. Two points here: (1) Look forward to the 2017 regional tournament in Augusta, GA, which is not that far away, and (2) start talking it up for the regionals in Huntsville or Madison in 2018. We will need a practical location for the tournament. Will Huntsville finish their new indoor sports facility replacing the Joe Davis Stadium in time for this tournament? Or will the tournament be conducted in the Von Braun Center's South Hall with flooring shipped in. Whichever way it will be a huge event in the South.

## The Rules Corner

The most notable distinguishing features of futsal are the **Kick-in**, the **Goal Clearance** and the requirement to take **all restarts within four seconds**. Let's examine each in turn to ensure a soccer player, who is new to futsal, does not do them wrong.



A **Kick-in** is awarded to a team in a futsal game in the exact same way a throw-in is awarded in a soccer game. After a Kick-in is performed to put the ball back into play, the same limitations exist as after a soccer throw-in, e.g. the kicker may not be the immediate next player to play the ball, the teammate/goalkeeper of the kicker may not play the ball with his/her hands, if the ball goes directly into the opponent's goal it doesn't count, etc. The notable differences are in the taking of a kick-in. The player must kick the ball instead of throw it. But like a throw-in the non-kicking foot must be on the touchline or off the pitch. After kicking the ball if it does not enter the pitch the Kick-in is given to the opposing team. And a Kick-in not completed within 4 seconds is given to the opposing team.



A **Goal Clearance** is awarded to a team in a futsal game in the exact same way a goal kick is awarded in a soccer game. After a Goal Clearance is performed to put the ball back into play, the same limitations exist as after a soccer goal kick, e.g. the ball must exit the penalty area to be in play, the goalkeeper may not be the immediate next player to play the ball, etc. The notable differences are in the taking of the Goal Clearance. The goalkeeper must deliver the ball back into play using only his/her hands, i.e. throw it, and may not kick it. For this reason Goal Clearances are often called Keeper Throws. But like a goal kick, a Goal Clearance must be performed from within the penalty area. (There is no goal area in futsal.) A Goal Clearance not completed within 4 seconds is awarded to the opposing team as an indirect free kick at the edge of the penalty area.



All restarts must be completed within **four seconds** of player's readiness to do so. Often the Referee will count the four seconds aloud and with his fingers over his/her head. While it is uncommon for a Referee to count aloud and display a finger count on kick-offs and penalty kicks, the four second requirement still applies. If a restart is not completed within four seconds, the ball is given to the opposing team but not always one for one. See list below.
